Chief Judge Michael Kramer of the 21<sup>st</sup> Judicial Circuit has extended his previous order limiting activity in the courthouses in Kankakee and Watseka until Monday, June 1, 2020. The previous order was set to expire on May 18, 2020. Both courthouses remain open for emergency matters including Domestic Violence Orders of Protection. The new order requires anyone entering the courthouse to be wearing their own face-covering or mask as required by Governor Pritzker's recent Order.

Judge Kramer expressed sincere appreciation to all the judges, judicial staff, clerks, bailiffs and security officers who have allowed the courthouses to continue to handle emergency matters during the COVID-19 crisis. "These frontline public servants have risked their own health to ensure uninterrupted access to justice in Kankakee and Iroquois counties and deserve our thanks," said Judge Kramer.
